









Background




However, there is a bigger question than "where are we going?" Tennessee's economy is booming, and policy decisions about key programs are making us shift the way we present information.





The State Senate is comprised of 33 Senatorial districts.

Each district has one elected Senator who is elected to a four year term with those from even-numbered districts being elected in the same general election, and those representing odd numbered districts being elected two years later.












Legislative Maps






Mapping your Boundaries



2010 > 2012 > 2013 > 2014 > 2016 > 2017

- LPAO dissolved.
- Consistent tracking and reporting of accurate boundaries to State/Federal agencies for many incorporations lost.







Feedback from the 2010 Census demonstrates the need for more accurate corporate boundaries reflected in the Census data.





2010 > 2012 > 2013 > 2014 > 2016 > 2017

- Discussions are held with the Census Bureau about the difference in data held by OLG and that of the Census.
- An agreement is reached to allow the updating of the Census data.







The Census Bureau suspends the 2014 BAS due to budget issues.







The TN Comptroller's Office becomes the lead agency in the BAS Partnership Agreement.







When Does the BAS Occur?

Date	Activity		
December 2016/January 2017	Annual response information is emailed to participants.		
January 1, 2017	All boundary changes must be legally in effect on or before this date to be reported in the 2017 BAS.		
January/February 2017	Non-Response email and telephone follow-up.		
March 1, 2017	BAS boundary updates submitted by this date will be reflected in the ACS and PEP published data in next year's BAS materials.		
March/April 2017	State Data Center non-response follow-up.		
May 31, 2017	BAS boundary updates submitted by this date will be reflected in next year's BAS materials.

Incorporation	STATE	Sections 6-1-206, 6-3-108	Secretary of State, and/or Department of Revenue
Disincorporation	STATE	Section 6-52-205	Secretary of State

Incorporations and disincorporations must be reported to the Secretary of State (Sec. 6-1-206, 6-3-108, & 6-52-205). All annexing municipalities must record annexation ordinances upon adoption or upon referendum approval of an annexation resolution with the register of deeds in the county or counties where the annexation was adopted or approved. The annexing municipality must describe the annexation and provide a copy of the ordinance or resolution to the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury as well as the assessor of property for each affected county (Sec. 6-51-121).








